The World Drum was made by the Sami medicineman and drummer Birger Mikkelsen after a vision from Whitecougar. It was initiated in a ceremony in front of the Norwegian Parliament in October -06. It was a part of the official celebration of the Sami national day in Gratangen, Norway. Since then it has travelled to Sweden, New Zealand, Hawaii, a tour around the states in USA, Finland, Denmark, England, Switzerland, and at this time The World Drum have reached Mets Nation in Canada.

From Canada it will go to the American Indian Council (Manataka) in USA and then back to Europe again for a tour through several countries. During 2009 it will travel to the far east visiting (so far) the Philipines, Indonesia, Japan, Mongolia, Nepal, Tuva and then to Australia. So far more than 25 countries are participating and the project has received support from several persons in official positions. The project is idealistic and has so far been made without financial support.

Why have you been given this?

Our aim is to bring your attention to this project both as a private person and as a person who has influence on governments and their actions. We have to make drastic actions to stop polluting and poisoning. We need to make bountiful harvesting of resources.
